- 3. Committee Review of Course Materials and Services Fee (CMSF) Proposals-The SFAC committee reviews all CMSF increase proposals received for the year and will submit recommendations to Provost Lavernia, including the reasoning for recommended approval or denial of each.

b. Henry Samueli School of Engineering

i. ENGRMAE 151, Mechanical Engineering Design- SFAC will table the review/discussion of this course for now. This is a senior course and were not able to get the surveys from the students before they graduated. They will see if they can get the current class to complete the surveys.

c. School of Physical Sciences

- i. Earth Systems Science 51, Field Methods Class- For field trip, if you estimate the reimbursement amount for the class to drive their own cars to Palm Springs (w/ 4 students to a car) and add in the tramway fee, the total comes out to about \$100 less than the proposal amount. Liability wise, it is probably safer to have students travel in a chartered bus. Of 46 possible respondents, they included that 28 people responded and 54% agreed to fee increase. There were no concerns from the committee on recommending this fee increase to Provost.
- ii. Chemistry- multiple proposals were submitted from this department. The committee will review them at the next SFAC meeting.
